THE PALM GOSPEL STORY

MARK 11:1-11

The Palm Gospel is proclaimed by the Presider. We listen carefully as the story unfolds.

Presider The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately." They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting,

"Hosanna!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!

Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David!

Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.



THE SECOND READING PHILIPPIANS 2:5-11



Holy and gracious God: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and maker of all. Jesus stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Savior Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper Jesus took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."


A (tapered end) --> B (thick end) Version 1 - Step 1











How to Fold a Palm Cross

Step 1 - Hold the frond horizontally.

Step 2 - Bend the right end straight up from the center to form a right angle.

Step 3 and 4 - Fold this same top strip, from the center, back and down, up and over again to form a square at the back. It will still be a right angle at this point.

Step 5 - Bring the left strip forward and fold over the center towards the right.

Step 6 - Fold away from you and pull through the square at the back, all the way.

Step 7 - Bend the top strip forward and put the end through the center square to make a shaft of desired length.

Step 8 - You may tuck the bottom of this strip back up into the centre square, some people leave it longer.

Step 9 and 10 - Fold the left hand strip backwards and put through the back square. This makes the left crossbar and should be in proportion to the shaft.

Step 11 - Fold the right strip back, put through the back square and fasten - adjust lengths to make each side of the cross beam even.
